LEASE

This LEASE, made this ___day of _____, 2023 by and between the County of Grainger, Tennessee acting through the County Mayor herein after referred to as the "County" and the Grainger County Historic Society, herein referred to as the "Historic Society".

WHEREAS, the Parties are agreed that the County shall lease to the Historic Society the following parcel of land located in Grainger County and within the corporate limits of the Town of Rutledge. Said parcel is described as being at the intersection of Water Street and State Route 92 and being also shown as Parcel 1 of Block C on Map 49-0 in the Tax Assessor's Office. Said property is improved with a structure being the old Grainger County Jail.

This LEASE is to run for a period of Ten (10) years with the right of renewal. The terms of said renewal shall be negotiated at the time of the renewal.

The consideration for this LEASE shall be One Dollar (\$1.00) paid by the Historic Society to the County.

The Historic Society shall indemnify the County against all liabilities, expenses and losses, including attorney's fees and other legal costs incurred by the County, including but not limited to, those occurring as a result of: (a) failure by the Historic Society to perform any covenant required to be performed by the Historic Society under this Agreement; (b) any accident, injury or damage caused by the Historic Society or its membel'Ship which shall happen in or about the leased property; (c) failure to comply with any requirements of-any governmental authority; and (d) any merchant's lien or security agreement filed against the leased property. The County shall not be liable for any personal injury to the Historic Society, its members, its guests, its invitees, or to any other occupant of any part of the leased property, or for any damages to any property of the Historic Society, irrespective of how such injury or damage may be caused, whether from action of the elements, condition of the leased premises, or acts of negligence of the County or otherwise; and the Historic Society hereby assumes the risks of any such injury or damage.

The Historic Society shall at all times during the term of this Lease carry public liability insurance with minimum limits of liability in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for bodily injury or death to any one person and an amount no less than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for damage to property. Such insurance policies shall name the Historic Society and the County as the insured parties thereunder. The Historic Society shall deliver to the County, certificates of insurance certifying that such insurance is in effect. The Historic Society understands that the County's insurance will not provide any coverage for theft or damage to the Historic Society's personal property.

The terms of this LEASE shall be as follows:

- 1. The Historic Society will help provide maintenance and cleaning of the Old County Jail.
- If the Historic Society shall cease to exist prior to the termination of this Lease then the Lease is automatically terminated and the property shall revert to the County free of said Lease.
- 3. Either party may terminate the Lease with a 90-day notice.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT **FOR EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS** BETWEEN GRAINGER COUNTY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICT AND **GRAINGER COUNTY**

Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-86-105(b)(6), this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for Emergency Communications (the "Agreement") is entered into between and among Grainger County, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee, and Grainger County Emergency Communications District (the "District"), a municipality and public corporation created and established pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-86-101, et seq.

WHEREAS, the District was established for the purpose of providing a system of emergency communications whereby a caller dialing 9-1-1 would immediately be connected to a public safety answering point that would quickly and efficiently assure that the appropriate emergency responders are notified;1 and

WHEREAS, such a system results in the saving of life, a reduction in the destruction of property, quicker apprehension of criminals, and ultimately the saving of money;2 and

WHEREAS, the District was established as a statutory municipality or public corporation in perpetuity, authorized to fund its operations through a bona fide emergency telephone service charge on all service users within its borders, whether business or residential, public, or private, profit making or not-for-profit, including governmental entities,3 and

WHEREAS, Grainger County and the District desire to conduct certain operations related to emergency communications jointly as contemplated by Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-86-105(b)(6).

- 1. Purpose. This Agreement is for the purpose of establishing the manner, terms, and conditions by which Grainger County and the District shall jointly provide 911 and dispatch service in the area. For purposes of this agreement "911 service" means the Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), lines, equipment, and personnel necessary to receive and answer 9-1-1 calls—the universal number that is used on telephone devices by the public at large for help in an emergency as defined in Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-86-103 (1). "Dispatch service" means Direct Dispatch, in which a PSAP upon receipt of a telephone call for emergency service, provides by commercial mobile radio for the dispatch of the appropriate emergency service units as defined in Tenn. Code Ann. 7-86-103 (10).
- 2. **Joint Emergency Communications District.** Grainger County and the District shall form a Joint Emergency Communications District as contemplated by Tenn. Code Annotated 7-86-105 (b) (6). The parties agree the District will continue to function and operate under the laws prescribed in Tenn. Code Annotated 7-86-105 (b) (1), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), and (i). The District Board of Directors shall consist of nine (9) members to govern the affairs of the District. The County Mayor shall appoint the members of the Board of Directors subject to confirmation by the County legislative body. The members shall serve for a term of four (4) years without compensation. The Board of Directors has the complete and sole authority to appoint a chair and other officers it may deem necessary from among the existing Board of Directors, employ such experts and consultants necessary to assist the Board in the discharge of its responsibilities to the extent of available funds. The Board has the authority to provide pension, insurance, or any other benefit plans deemed appropriate for District employees. No member of the Board shall be an employee of the District.
- 3. Cooperative Agreement. The parties agree to jointly provide 9-1-1 within the District and dispatch services for all emergency responders within the unincorporated area of the District.

The District hereby agrees to be responsible for providing the following operational aspects of 9-1-1 service in the District:

A 9-1-1 Emergency Communications Center capable of receiving and dispatching calls for service utilizing the direct dispatch method (TCA 7-86-107 A.); a 9-1-1 telephone controller with the capability of receiving traditional land line, Voice Over Internet Protocol (VOIP), wireless, and text 9-1-1 calls for service; a radio console, radios, and antennas with the capability of communicating with law enforcement, EMS, EMA, fire departments, and rescue squads; a digital voice recorder that captures all communications that come into the Communications Center; Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) System that generates a record of all calls for assistance from emergency service providers conducting business and service via the Emergency Communications Center and a NET Clock that receives time data from a government satellite to accurately time stamp all records. The District will staff the Communications Center with two (2) trained and certified telecommunicators 24 hours a day 7 days a week to provide service for all callers and emergency service providers within the District; provide GIS mapping of all public and private roads within the District; addressing all residential and business structures, maintaining, and updating maps and addresses within a computer database; provide Pictometry software and or data with oblique and ortho imagery of Grainger County with annual updates to all Grainger County Government Offices or by log in to Pictometry online; provide a full-time map/address and floodplain coordinator to enter and maintain all map/address and street information within the District; provide all radio equipment with FCC licensing related to the functionality of the law enforcement, EMS, and fire/rescue channels at the three remote repeater sites--Avondale, Blaine, and Short Mountain; provide electricity with emergency backup generator with service and maintenance to the Clinch Mountain tower site to keep radio communication active in the event of power failure for all emergency service providers; maintain the fencing and the property at the old Fire Tower site at Avondale; provide administrative staff to maintain an accurate account of any and all monies for the District in accordance with the State Comptroller guidelines, maintain all records pertaining to NCIC in accordance with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) rules and regulations; and provide a full-time director to coordinate with telephone service providers, emergency service providers, equipment vendors, and all federal, state, and local governments relating to 9-1-1 service within the District.

Grainger County hereby agrees to be responsible for providing the following operational aspects of 9-1-1 and dispatch service in the District:

Provide a functional facility located in the Justice Center to house the 9-1-1 Emergency Communications Operations Center; provide the District operations center water, sewer, cleaning, garbage pickup, and electricity with emergency back-up generator power.

4. Funding. The District hereby agrees to be responsible for funding the following aspects of 9-1-1 and dispatch service:

All charges and related expenses to service providers for 9-1-1 trunk lines, all maintenance and related expenses for emergency telephone service, radio equipment and licensing, CAD, mapping, and computer hardware, software, and all payroll related expenses for GCECD employees.

Grainger County hereby agrees to be responsible for funding the following aspects of 9-1-1 direct dispatch service:

A contribution to the District of Two Hundred Fifty-Two Thousand (\$252,000) for 9-1-1 and dispatch service to all emergency service providers, mapping & addressing service, access and use of EagleView (Pictometry), and the use of radio frequencies licensed to GCECD for radio communications with emergency service providers within the unincorporated area of Grainger County for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.

The parties hereby acknowledge that, consistent with Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-86-303 (e), reimbursements by the Tennessee Emergency Communications Board shall be a base amount not less than the District received in fiscal year 2012. The Board may not reduce the base funding amount unless local government funding is reduced.

5. State, Federal, and Local Compliance. The parties hereby agree to fully comply with the applicable Policies, Orders, Regulations, and Revenue and Operational Standards of the Tennessee Emergency Communications Board, the applicable rules, regulations, and orders of the Federal Communications Commission, the guidelines of the Grainger County ECD Radio Communication & Digital Radio Procedure, the Grainger County

ECD Call Guide, and any and all applicable federal and state laws in the performance of this agreement.

- 6. **Term.** The Parties hereby concur that this agreement shall continue for one (1) year from July 1, 2023, until June 30, 2024.
- Nondiscrimination. The parties hereby agree, warrant, and assure that no person shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the performance of this agreement on the grounds of disability, age, race, color, religion, sex, national origin, or any other classification protected by federal, Tennessee state constitutional, or statutory law.
- 8. Liability. The District agrees to maintain adequate liability insurance coverage for the District, District employees, and the District's Board of Directors.
- 9. Records. The District will maintain an accurate time-stamped computer-generated record of all calls for service within the District, and a digital time-stamped recording of all telephone and radio communication within the District's Central Dispatch Center.
- Severability. If any of the terms and conditions of this contract is held to be invalid or unenforceable as a matter of law, the other terms and conditions hereof shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect. To this end, the terms and conditions of this agreement are declared severable.
